

We are the Catholic Parish Community of St. Philip Neri, answering Christ's call to discipleship through Word, Sacrament and Service. We proclaim God's hope and love to all.

From the Pastor

We are the people of the Eucharist! Dear parishioner of St. Philip Neri, brothers and sisters in the Lord. Over the last year, discussions have been taking place with Staff, the Pastoral Council, Liturgy Committee and others concerning our Sunday Mass Schedule. I believe I might have on occasion at Mass expressed my concerns about weekend Priest Assistance. Ten years ago, we had a great deal of help from my brother Priests; unfortunately, our numbers have dwindled resulting in my brother Priests to other assignments. The Barnabites who were assisting us for many years were the only Priests who were officially assigned to help here on weekends. Their Community over the many years has decreased in the number of men due to old age and death. The result being that they could no longer help us as weekend Celebrants of the Masses. Father Doug from De Sale's had to stop coming, due to being needed elsewhere. He helped here occasionally not being assigned, but out of charity. Other friends of mine assisted when available; Father Jeff Stecz, Father Marc Capizzi and of course, our beloved Father Chung. Father Stecz has become a Pastor, Father Capizzi an Assistant way out in Chester County. Father Chung in his time here on weekends was first for many years the School Minister at Archbishop Wood, and for the past three (3) years, the Secretary for the Archbishop. I can say the Archbishop, because of Father Chung, knows the parish of St. Philip Neri very well. A few weeks ago at the 11:00 am Sunday Mass, he was here for his first visit to celebrate Confirmation, a joyful celebration and very relaxed. I was able to spend a few moments alone in the Chapel with him and in conversation told me that Father Chung would be moving on to another assignment. Bishop Chaput said three (3) years as his Secretary was enough for anyone, and I said you will miss him. They have become good friends. Father Chung will become a Pastor. I at this time cannot tell you where, but the assignments will be public shortly. Father Chung will no longer be available to help here at St. Philip Neri. Once again he was not assigned here, but helped us in brotherly priestly charity. What I have been speaking about for many years is coming to fruition. There unfortunately, no other priests

available for weekend Mass assistance. Father Smart and myself are the only two available. You must remember Father Smart is retired due to health and like us all is aging. Father stays here about two (2) nights during the week, so he will be here to help with Masses. On occasion on weekends, he is unable to be here and then I am responsible for all weekend Masses. It is not uncommon to have three (3) Masses on Saturday and one in awhile four (4) Masses. Then three (3) Sunday Masses in a row. You might say "well saying Masses is easy" and I love celebrating Mass and Sacraments, but the celebration is an intense experience of concentration, prayer and meditation. The three (3) Sunday Masses in a row are draining. Added to this we noticed a drop in attendance at the 11:00 am Mass especially during the summer. All of this is the reason for the Sunday Mass schedule to change. During the summer we will evaluate these changes. I have to tell you that this by far has been the most difficult and agonizing decision I have ever had to make here at St. Philip Neri. (I don't say this often or ever, but, please do keep me in your prayers). Beginning the Sunday after Memorial Day, June 5th, the Sunday Mass schedule will be:

The Vigil Mass on Saturday evening 5:00 pm (remains the same), Sunday morning Masses: 7:30 am (remains the same); the now 9:30 am Mass will be changed to 10:00 am, the 11:00 am Mass will be dropped, but we will add a Sunday evening Mass at 5:00 pm.

I hope that it will not be an inconvenience for you. For me it will not be overwhelming if I need to say all weekend Masses, there will not be three (3) in a row. In other ways, it is a sacrifice: my Sunday evenings will not be free to visit my family and friends. Since there is more time between Masses, it also allows me to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation more frequently. Scheduled Confessions on Saturday's remains the same - 4:00 pm to 4:45 pm. I can now and will hear Confessions before the Sunday 10:00 am Mass and the Sunday 5:00 pm Mass. These added scheduled times will hopefully make it easier for you to receive this beautiful Sacrament. Sunday schedule Confession time will be 9:15 am to 9:45 am and 4:00 pm to 4:45 pm. However, your cooperation is important. I must end the Confession times at their scheduled time so Mass does not start late. The Greeters or Ushers may have to cut the line off. (that would be a great thing, so many receiving the Sacrament) but you can tell them you would like to have your Confession heard after Mass.

They will tell me and I will gladly return to the Confessional.

Please pray for me, the parish and most especially for an increase in Priestly Vocations. Encourage them in your families and in the parish. I can honestly say it is a wonderful life, challenging, full of excitement and surprises at times, but for me I could not imagine or do anything else.

We are the people of the Eucharist, for this we need Priests and also the Priest needs you!

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Mother knows best

This year Mother's Day and World Communications Day both fall on today's date. The latter was established by the Second Vatican Council to focus on the evangelical potential of modern means of information exchange. Important to be sure, but our Mother Mary, like most mothers, communicates with her children in more personal (albeit, in her case, extraordinary) ways. And what does she say when she appears? Her messages can be summarized simply: Pray and be healed. Amid the information bombardment of today's digital age, stop and listen to Mary and heed her loving command.

Today's Readings: Acts 7:55-60; Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20; John 17:20-26 (61). "The world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me."

EASTER WEEKDAY

The pain of exile is all around us

The great Italian poet Dante Alighieri was born on this day in 1265. His *Divine Comedy* is considered one of the great works of world literature. Deeply involved in the political strife of medieval Florence, Dante was forced into exile and wrote of the bitterness of the experience, in lines that speak to anyone who has been forced to flee homeland and loved ones. Read them in solidarity with the millions who are living in exile in our war-torn times: "You shall leave everything you love most, this is the arrow that the bow of exile shoots first. But when Pamphile fell ill at the time the Sacred Hearts were sending priests to the Hawaiian missions, the younger Damien volunteered to take his place. No one put much confidence in Damien, who had no brain for booklearning, questionable social skills, and no patience at all with authority. What Damien did among those afflicted with leprosy at Molokai far outweighed any of his limitations. Let your love be bigger than your limitations!

EASTER WEEKDAY

This thing could go either way

Saint Augustine wrote that we humans are "like a horse, with either God or the devil as rider." That's a rather colorful way to describe the struggle we all encounter as we try to do the right thing but slip up regularly and can take a hard fall if we are not alert in our spiritual life and self-control. We are pleasure-seeking, pain-avoiding creatures, but it's easy to confuse cheap diversion for true wellness. Who's holding the reins in your own life? If you're being taken for a ride you'd rather not go on, now is the time to buck up!

Today's Readings: Acts 20:28-38; John 17:11b-19 (299). "I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction."

FEAST OF NEREUS AND ACHILLEUS, MARTYRS

Study war no more

The carnage of war and the horrors of mass atrocities would not be possible if the foot soldiers of the world, *en masse*, refused to carry out orders. Easier said than done, as soldiers are constrained by powerful systems that force them to follow orders or face lethal consequences. Few of us would have the courage to resist in such a situation. Nereus and Achilleus did. After participating in cruel persecutions of early Christians they threw down their weapons even though

they knew the fate that awaited them. Say a prayer of thanks for courageous acts of faith and be a "warrior for love."

Today's readings: Acts 22:30; 23:6-11; John 17:20-26 (300). "I made known to them your name . . . that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Ask Mary

On May 13, 1917, in the midst of war-torn Europe, three local children reported that a beautiful lady appeared to them in their hometown of Fatima, Portugal. They reported that she asked the children to pray the rosary each day and to honor her Immaculate Heart. In time, the church agreed with the children that the Blessed Virgin Mary indeed had appeared. To this day, thousands journey to Fatima to seek Mary's counsel and help. In May 2010, Pope Benedict XVI prayed at the church of Our Lady of Fatima "as a homage of gratitude... for the marvels that the Almighty has worked through you in the hearts of so many who come as pilgrims to this your maternal home." Today is a day to say Mary's prayer, the rosary, to ask for God's peace.


SATURDAY, MAY 14
