From the desk of Sister Patricia Kelly, M.S.B.T.

Excerpts from **A Memorial Day Reflection from America's Late Peace-Priest** by Tony Magliano.

The best way to remember those who have been killed in battle is to work for the day when others will no longer be sent to take their place. Prayerfully reflecting on how to move away from war and war preparation should be central to every Memorial Day.

Why do presidents and congresses send young men and women to kill and be killed? Why do most Americans so easily accept their worn out, immoral answers? And why can't we finally learn to wage peace instead of war?

Some time ago, reflecting on these very questions, I turned for insight to America's pre-eminent Catholic anti-war veteran, the recently deceased Father Daniel Berrigan, S.J. ...Father Berrigan said that, as a young Jesuit, he met and worked with two great Catholic figures of the 20th Century: Dorothy Day and Trappist Father Thomas Merton. Their deep spirituality and uncompromising commitment to non-violence had a lasting effect upon his life ...

Father Berrigan, along with several others, did a variety of acts of civil disobedience. The most symbolic, which landed him in prison, was when he and eight other protesters used napalm to highlight the fact that American warplanes were dropping napalm bombs on countless Vietnamese Civilians.

"What so make of the Sermon on the Mount, while all this is going on," questioned Father Berrigan. "Jesus lived in non-violence, he commanded us to love our enemies."

Berrigan not only opposed the violence of war, but consistently opposed all forms of violence. Having protested at abortion centers, he said: "A decent society should no more have an abortion clinic than the Pentagon." Are we Christian who happen to be American? Or are Americans who happen to be Christian?

May the peace-maker, Father Daniel Berrigan, rest in eternal peace with the God of Peace. And through his intercession, may all who claim to be disciples of the Prince of Peace, sincerely pray and sacrificially work to build up the Peaceable Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

The power of a single voice

The feast of Corpus Christi is popular and moving because it is simple and direct—it's all about the Eucharist, one of the greatest treasures of Catholicism. Yet the feast would not exist were it not for the efforts of Juliana of Liège, a Norbertine canoness born in 1191 in Liège, Belgium, a city where there were groups of women dedicated to eucharistic worship. She had a vision of a full moon with one dark spot signifying the lack of a feast day solely dedicated to the Eucharist. She shared her vision and eventually vision became reality. What gift can you envision giving to your community?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 9:11b-17 (169)*. "Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God."

MONDAY, MAY 30

Heal the wounds of war

On this Memorial Day, as you remember those who gave their lives serving their country, also keep in your heart those who have lost loved ones, those struggling with physical and emotional wounds, and all other victims of war. Pray and work for the reconciliation of divided peoples and for peace in your community and around the world. The U.S. bishops urge all to pray on this day: "Banish violence from our midst and wipe away our tears, that we may all deserve to be called your sons and daughters."

TODAY'S READINGS: *2 Peter 1:2-7;*

Mark 12:1-12 (353). "May grace and peace be yours in abundance through knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord."

TUESDAY, MAY 31

FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Look who's here!

A friend comes to visit. Just the thought can redeem the darkest day! Whether we're confined by illness, grieving a loss, in need of practical assistance, or just pleasantly surprised by a familiar face at the door, the time of visitation is a bright hour of consolation. The encounter between Mary and Elizabeth was more than the welcome arrival of help for an aged mother's third trimester. God's saving power intersected these two lives and gave them to each other, to share the joy. Bring good news to someone today.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Zephaniah 3:14-18a or Romans 12:9-16; Luke 1:39-56 (572)*.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 1

FEAST OF JUSTIN, MARTYR

What's the good Word?

Christian theology owes a debt to the pre-Christian philosophies of Plato and Aristotle. Early church theologian Justin was able to see connections between the great philosophers of Greek antiquity and the wisdom revealed by Jesus. The prologue of John's Gospel speaks of Jesus as "Logos," the preexisting Word. Justin believed that the "seeds of Christianity" found in thinkers such as Plato or Aristotle were evidence of the Logos acting in history before Christ's incarnation.

Whether or not Plato and Aristotle were “unknowing Christians,” *we* are *knowing* Christians. Spend some time with the Word today.

TODAY’S READINGS: *2 Timothy 1:1-3, 6-12; Mark 12:18-27 (355)*. “*Are you not misled because you do not know the scriptures or the power of God?*”

THURSDAY, JUNE 2

FEAST OF MARCELLINUS AND PETER, MARTYRS

Exercise with caution

We don’t know a lot about Marcellinus and Peter, martyred in 304, but we know Peter was an exorcist, an often misunderstood or over-dramatized office of church ministry. The rite itself was revised in 1999 for the first time since 1614, and modern practice counsels priests empowered to perform an exorcism to first make sure they are dealing with genuine possession rather than mental illness. The *Code of Canon Law* states that the bishop is to give permission to perform the rite to a priest “who has piety, knowledge, prudence, and integrity of life.” We rely on Jesus to protect us from the power of evil, and the church stands by our side should we need assistance in doing so.

TODAY’S READINGS: *2 Timothy 2:8-15; Mark 12:28-34 (356)*. “*You are not far from the kingdom of God.*”

FRIDAY, JUNE 3

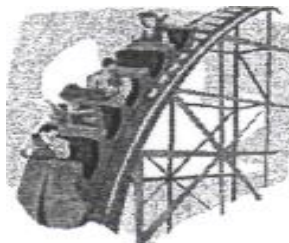

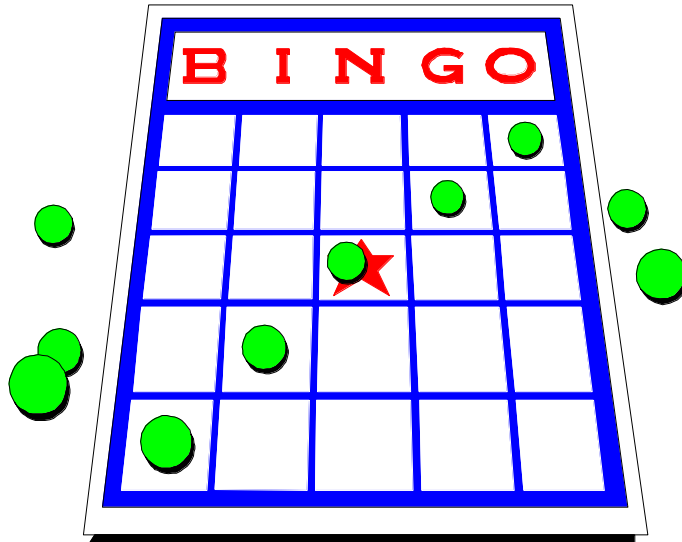
