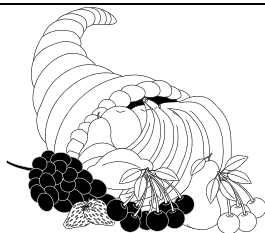

MEMORIAL OF MARTIN DE PORRES, RELIGIOUS

Holiness overcomes divisions

Born in Peru in 1579, Saint Martin de Porres, the child of unwed parents of two different races, occupied the lowest level of society, so much so that he didn't feel worthy to become a Dominican brother, applying rather to be a "lay helper." After years of service, his community, inspired by his example and prayer life, asked him to make full profession. Martin was known to treat all people equally no matter their race or status, with special attention to those on the bottom of the social ladder. As the world continues to struggle with race relations today, let us pray to be like Saint Martin de Porres: humble servants seeking pure hearts.

MEMORIAL OF CHARLES BORROMEIO, BISHOP

Teach from the heart

During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, Catholics have been urged to perform the works of mercy, one of which is to instruct those lacking education. Saint Charles Borromeo understood that poor education leads to abuses, and during the Counter-Reformation, he established seminaries for clergy, who often had received scant education prior to that. His efforts helped quell corruption in the church. How can you take what you learned this year about mercy and help educate others in how to practice it?

Jesus told his disciples the "person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones."
