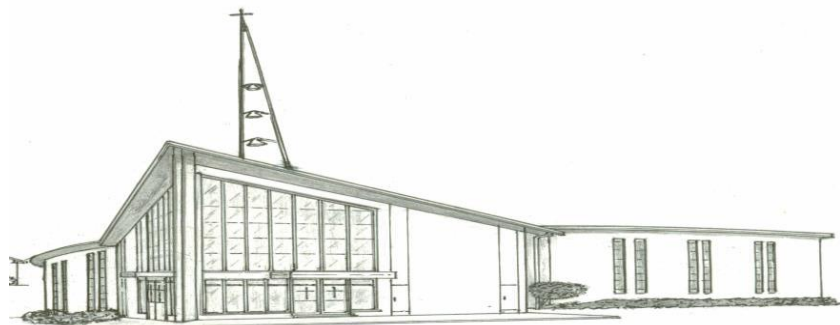

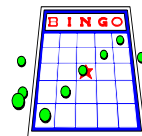

Dear Friends in Christ,

On September 4th in Saint Peter's Square, Pope Francis proclaimed Mother Teresa of Calcutta a Saint to be honored by the Universal Church. In many ways, the canonization was just a seal of confirmation for a life lived in total dedication to God's people, especially the most neglected. The Ministry of Saint Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity exemplifies for all of us the power of the Holy Spirit working through human beings, with all their talents and deficiencies, to give witness to Jesus and the Gospel.

Our many Religious men and women who have served our Archdiocese have given a similar example in education, caring for the sick and abandoned, and in a variety of apostolic endeavors geared to changing times. Likewise, our contemplative Religious, in lives of prayer and solitude, bring down upon us numerous graces.

With gratitude for their ministry over the years and conscious of the increasing demands of retirement care, each year our dioceses sponsor The Retirement Fund for Religious Collection. This appeal enables all of us to generously thank our Religious for their service and to let them know that we do not forget them in their needs, particularly in their later years.

As Archbishop, I ask that you remember all our Religious in prayerful remembrance and in generous support of the collection scheduled for December 3/4. I am quite sure that these men and women will appreciate your kindness and concern. May the Lord's peace abide with us all.

Dear friends,

Earlier this year, I alerted you to proposed state legislation that would endanger many of the parishes, schools and charities of Pennsylvania's 3.2 million Catholics. The bill, known as House Bill 1947, contained several provisions to protect children from sexual abuse. Unfortunately, it also contained damaging language that would have allowed retroactive civil lawsuits to be filed against religious and private institutions, while protecting public entities from the same kind of lawsuits for exactly the same kinds of sexual abuse.

In June, the state Senate voted 49-0 in favor of an amended version of House Bill 1947. The revised Senate legislation stripped out the unfair provision on retroactivity, largely because of its incompatibility with our state Constitution. The revised Senate bill did, however, keep other provisions in the bill that would have served the needs of abuse survivors.

To move forward, the changes made in the Senate required the bill to be reconsidered in the House. It now seems that the bill will not be considered during the remaining days of the current legislative session. This means that none of its more acceptable measures will be passed into law.

Retroactive removal of the civil statute of limitation is unconstitutional under our Commonwealth's constitution. More importantly, as our pastors, along with many of our lay leaders, families and I stressed this spring, it is unjust. By unreasonably insisting on keeping retroactive provisions in the bill, a small number of individuals failed whole segments of the population who stood to benefit from the bill's other measures.

The Archdiocese is fully committed to protecting our young people from sexual abuse and assisting victims of past abuse with their healing. This will not change. At the same time, we will continue to update you about legislation that threatens the health of our parishes and Catholic ministries. Many of you made your concerns about HB 1947 very clear to our lawmakers this year, and it made a difference. I'm very grateful. When contact with our legislators is done respectfully, in a spirit of good will, the public life of our Commonwealth is well served. In January, a new legislative session will begin. Bills like HB 1947 are likely to resurface. I promise to keep you informed as we deal with these issues.

On the spiritual journey, it can be easy to think that you can figure everything out, that your mind is the only tool you need. On the journey of life, though, you have to engage the heart. Any other way is, according to contemplative author Cynthia Bourgeault, “like trying to play a violin with a saw.” Faith stretches far beyond what our minds can comprehend. As you begin this Advent, how might you trust in the glory of God that is coming? May your heart and mind be stretched by the answer that you find!

TODAY’S READINGS: *Isaiah 4:2-6; Matthew 8:5-11* ([175](#)). “*For over all, the Lord’s glory will be shelter and protection.*”

ADVENT WEEKDAY

Keep your Christmas presence under wraps

This Advent, try experiencing Christmas in a more gradual way. Instead of jumping into Christmas the day after Thanksgiving, allow the symbols, rich colors, poetry, and music of Advent to wash over you slowly during these weeks. Take time to contemplate the pillars of Advent: Isaiah stoking humanity’s longing for the Redeemer, Mary bringing Jesus into history, and John the Baptist urging us to begin a new life. Maybe even put up your Christmas tree later than usual, closer to Christmas Eve. If you experience “the holidays” as an exhausting trial, let Advent calm you. Let its mystery refocus your life and make you hungry for God.

TODAY’S READINGS: *Isaiah 11:1-10; Luke 10:21-24* ([176](#)). “*From His roots a bud shall blossom.*”

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 30

FEAST OF ANDREW, APOSTLE

Raise up the cross

Tradition says that Saint Andrew died crucified on an “X” shaped cross. Saint Andrew’s Cross is best-known for its depiction on the Scottish flag. According to legend, while praying on the eve of battle, King Óengus II promised that if victory was granted, he would name Saint Andrew as the patron saint of Scotland, which is why he is honored on the flag. Pray that Saint Andrew intercedes for victory in our daily struggles.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Romans 10:9-18; Matthew 4:18-22 (684)*. "As he went from there, he saw ... James son of Zebedee and his brother John ... and he called them."

Pray for a "Day without AIDS"

Since 1988, December 1 has been recognized as World AIDS Day. The following year, the first "Day without Art" was organized. More than 800 arts organizations, museums, and galleries throughout the United States covered works of art and instead displayed information about HIV. Globally there are an estimated 34 million people who have the HIV virus. Since 1984, more than 35 million people have died of HIV or AIDS. Let's remember all those with AIDS-related illnesses, past and present. Let's pray for them and for those who work tirelessly to care for them and to find a cure.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 26:1-6; Matthew 7:21, 24-27 (178)*. "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock."

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 2

ADVENT WEEKDAY

Time to be truly free, at last

Legalized slavery was abolished by the end of the 19th century, but sadly it still flourishes underground. Today is the annual commemoration of the United Nation's International Day for the Abolition of Slavery. Every year, thousands of poor and defenseless men, women, and children fall into the hands of

human traffickers who expose them to sexual exploitation, forced labor, warfare, and even removal of vital organs. Jesus came to set us free; let's do our part to see that the world hears that message loud and clear by working to [protect victims of human trafficking](#).

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 29:17-24; Matthew 9:27-31 (179)*. "Let it be done for you according to your faith."

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 3

MEMORIAL OF FRANCIS XAVIER, PRIEST

Strong beyond their numbers

Saint Francis Xavier was a seasoned missionary who traveled to India, China, and other places in Asia. He is the first Christian missionary to go to Japan. He wrote that the Japanese were the "best people yet discovered." He found them kind and polite, yet the work of evangelization was difficult in Japan. When Saint Francis left two years later, Japan had some 2,000 new Christians. Today the number of Catholics in Japan is still small, representing less than 0.5 percent of the population. Let's remember them today and remember Catholics in all in those places where they represent a small minority.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 30:19-21, 23-26; Matthew 9:35—10:1, 5a, 6-8 (180)*. "As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.'"
